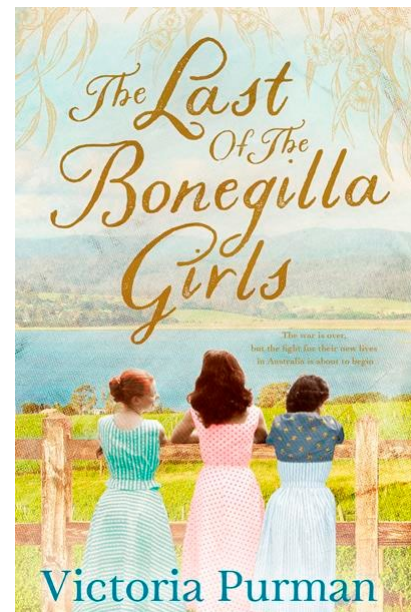
'The Last of the Bonegilla Girls' - Author talk and lunch on Saturday, June 2, 2018
